



Basics You Need to Know As a New Member/Applicant

- 1 New applicants must attend two consecutive club meetings and are not an official member of the CMC until he/she is voted into the club and pays his/her dues in full. This includes not riding on the CMC Club grounds until he/she pays dues in full.
- 2 Once voted into the CMC, the new applicant must pay his/her dues in full by the following regular CMC meeting, or he/she must begin the application process from the start.
- 3 New applicants may not utilize the CMC Club Grounds until he/she is instated as a member according to the by-laws.
- 4 As a courtesy to our neighbors, bikes can only be run between the hours of 9 AM and 8:45 PM, 7 days per week.
- 5 The event track is closed for riding Thursday thru Sunday on the week of an event.
- 6 When leaving the club grounds, if there are no other members remaining, please be sure to close and lock the gate behind you.
- 7 Members of the Cadillac Motorcycle Club are NOT allowed to bring guests (brothers, cousins, girlfriends, uncles, buddies, etc...) to ride at the club grounds. (Associate members are allowed to ride/utilize the club grounds: spouse, children)
- 8 It is the duty of CMC members to know the Constitution and By Laws. If you have a question, you should contact your sponsor.
- 9 Option #1 (working) members must work a minimum of 40 qualifying work hours per year. Members will be required to provide a worker for all race events for the 12 consecutive months after being voted in.
- 10 Option #3 (Intermediate working) members must work a minimum of 20 qualifying work hours per year. Members will be required to provide a worker for a minimum of two race events each year.
- 11 Timecards must be turned in within 60 days. Workers cannot be another primary club member and must be 16 years old or older for flagging purposes.
- 12 Meetings are held the 2nd Monday of each month.
- 13 Club members are responsible to update the Vice President with current: address, phone & e-mail information.
- 14 Members are considered to be "probationary members" for the first year, and will not have voting rights in club affairs.

Violation of any of these rules will result in penalties up to and including being expelled from the Cadillac Motorcycle Club.
